

Key Benchmarks

Intervention Teams

Learning Dashes

Our Learning Dashes have supported students to enhance their skills as a "Balanced Reader". By reading with a skilled adult each day we have recorded our highest level of students reaching or exceeding reading benchmarks this year.









Tiered Oral Language Initiative

With an updated English syllabus focusing on oral language in the early years, St Edward's was ahead of the curve by providing a tiered Oral Language intervention to support our students in Kindergarten to Year 2. Our Oral Language Specialist Teacher developed programs to support students expressive and receptive language skills.









Partnerships: University Of Newcastle - Occupational Therapy Program

At St Edward's School we are continually striving to develop partnerships with allied health services in order to better support the students in our care.

This year, we again have the opportunity to partner with The University of Newcastle to implement an Occupational Therapy Program. This involves all students in Kindergarten completing a screening assessment and in class support with an occupational Therapist.







School Intervention Team Meetings

The School Intervention Team is a collaborative forum that uses a multi-disciplinary approach to identify and develop interventions for students.

St Edward's School Intervention Team is a schoolbased, problem-solving group designed to provide an efficient, effective and clearly defined procedure for providing assistance to students, teachers and parents. Its purpose is to select interventions that will be implemented in a school setting, determine the timeline for implementation and monitor the goal.



Personal Plans

Inclusive education ensures that all students can access and fully participate in learning with reasonable adjustments that are tailored to individual needs. As a Catholic school we are called to be inclusive as we believe that everyone of our students is made in the image and likeness of God. Just as Jesus celebrated all people and included all, we aim to do the same. We have a saying here at St Edward's- same is not fair. We aim for equity not equality. Inclusive education at St Edward's School means that each student receives the support and adjustments they require to access a positive and enriching learning experience.

Individualised learning is key to ensuring all students can access the curriculum and achieve their personal best. At St Edward's our students work with teachers and parents to develop personal learning goals that support next steps in achievement. All individual learning goals are informed by data and allow students the opportunity to thrive.

Partnership with McCarthy Catholic College

During 2022 we have had the opportunity to partner with our feeder high school, McCarthy Catholic College in a variety of ways. Students from McCarthy in the Year 9 PASS class have assessed the gross motor skills of Kindergarten students and then planned and delivered a 10 week program to support the development of fundamental physical activity skills.







During Term 4, students from the Child Studies class supported our 2023 Kindergarten students to have a successful transition to school.

St. Edward's partners with McCarthy Catholic College by supporting students completing the Certificate 3 in Educational Support as part of their HSC..







Reading/Writing Focus

Cold Write

As directed by the CSO, Cold Writes are completed four times a year across various text types. Cold Writes are used to monitor growth in writing and are assessed using a set criterion scale.

This growth data is collated on an electronic whole school Data Wall. Assessment results are used by teachers to plan for differentiation during guided writing groups and establishing student writing goals.



Big Write

At St. Edward's we use the Big Write and VCOP methodology to improve our student writing outcomes.

This methodology is based on the notion that if students cannot say the language, they cannot write it. Every week across our school students engage in a Big Write. Lights are dimmed, music is played and the environment is set for writing. The following day students engage in a reflection on their learning and the learning of others through Breakdown Buddies, Highlighting and the completing the Student Criterion Scales. New writing goals are developed based on this



Whole School **English Block**

St Edward's School has a strong focus on students' Literacy skills. To support the development of these skills, the school has implemented a two hour English Block, four days a week across our school. As part of this uninterrupted block, the Gradual Release of Responsibility Model (GRRM) along with visible Learning Intentions and Success Criteria are utilised by teachers to ensure students are given the best opportunity to achieve personal success. During this time, you will see students engaging in a range of reading, writing and speaking and listening activities that have been carefully selected based on the individual students ability.





Moderation Practice

At St. Edward's School the moderation of assessment tasks is an integral part of developing consistent practice. In order for our staff to gain a consistent understanding of what makes a 'balanced reader' teachers need to collaboratively assess students using the PM benchmarking process and engage in reflective discussion about the skills and strategies of the reader. A similar process takes place when assessing student progress in writing. Using the criterion scales aligned to the Big Write methodology, staff compare different work samples assessed at the same level in order to give consistent grades and plan for future learning.



Pre-Kinder Program

1000 Books Before School

1000 Books Before School is a project aimed at enabling our next year's Kindergarten class to access the curriculum at a Kindergarten standard. Families are invited to borrow a set of 6 books at a time to engage and interact with their child. Vocabulary, story, discussion around words and just pure enjoyment of literature are the key focus of the project. Improved interaction with and discussion about literature are proven prerequisites for reading success at school.





Kinder Readiness Expo

Our transition to school program starts in Term 1 where parents and carers are invited to our Kindergarten Readiness Expo. This event allows parents to find out more about what Kindergarten is all about as well as having access to a variety of allied health specialists. By supporting our families to access professional advice from a speech therapist, occupational therapist, nutritionist, hearing and vision specialist we are setting our students up for success.



Parent Workshops - Reading and Oral Language

Research suggests that a strong partnership with parents is a good indicator of student success. St Edward's staff work hard to ensure our parent body has a variety of opportunities to engage in learning around how they can support their child to reach their full potential. Reading and Oral Language parent workshops were offered during Term 1 of the academic year to encourage shared understanding and use of resources across both home and school.





St Edward's Playgroup

The formation of the St Edward's playgroup has been a successful way to support children to transition from preschool to "big school". The opportunity to familiarise children and families with the school and staff as well as provide education around school readiness is invaluable in enabling our wider community to understand our school vision.



Library Connections

Early Birds

Our Early Bird Reading Club is designed to inspire and encourage greater interest in, and therefore practise, with reading. The more time a student tends to reading activities, the better their success at school and, indeed, life! A love of literature will develop better reading habits and this, in turn, develops greater comprehension and word attack skills. A fun sticker collection activity turns reading habits into a genre collection, and a sense of achievement is developed at the same time.





Inspired Learners

Inspired Learners is a curriculum based research opportunity. High achieving readers from Years 3, 4, and 5 are identified and given the opportunity to explore curriculum areas in a more personalised way. At the same time, greater than grade level reading occurs, research skills are introduced and pursued, and research terms such as bibliography, sources, key words and plagiarism are explained. Students also get an opportunity to share their research findings with peers and parents.









Library Leaders

Our Library Leaders are a dynamic part of our library day. They are relied upon to reshelf books, tidy and dust, run errands and take things to the recycling. This prestigious role is limited to Year 5 and Year 2. Applicants are put on trial for a few weeks to show their dedication to the job and their love of all things reading and books. We are very grateful to the students who take on this responsible role and are committed to the general wellbeing of our library.

School Clubs

At any recess break, students at St Edward's can be found participating in our various clubs. This year we have been running Lego Club, Games Club and Chess Club, and next year we are introducing a club to give further opportunity to share a passion for reading with like minded people. The inaugural members of this new club are working on a catchy name in readiness to start full steam in 2023. There is nothing like the buzz of a group of students sharing the excitement they have for something they have just read and loved, and another student catching the enthusiasm and reading the book too!













First Nations Programs

Cultural Hub

Our First Nation students have enjoyed the opportunity to learn more about their indigenous heritage through the use of events, festivals, and workshops throughout the year.









Umbrella Project

Our First Nations Umbrellas, with indigenous art printed on them, were unveiled as part of our 2022 NAIDOC celebrations. Our students learnt about many symbols including water holes, tribes and rivers. They are a wonderful addition to our school and our students love them!







First Nations Cultural Learning Plans

As part of our personalised approach to student learning our First Nations students develop their own professional learning plans. The learning plans were created in collaboration with students, parents/carers and teachers to cater to the unique needs of each learner. This way, everyone is engaged and motivated throughout their schooling journey.



First Nations Collection - Library

In 2021 it was identified that our First Nations Collection was lacking. There has been a concerted effort over the past 18 months to grow and develop the books in our library that identify Indigenous themes and stories. The current publishing climate in Australia means that there are more quality publications in this arena than ever before. It is imperative at St Edward's that all students have an opportunity to be exposed to these narratives, but it is especially important that our First Nations students have books and stories they can identify with and can visually see that Indigenous stories are valued and celebrated.







St Edward's Teacher **Action Research Initiative**



Teacher Led Workshops

St Edward's has a very strong focus on Teacher Professional Development and prioritises where possible opportunities for teachers to share their skills and expertise through Teacher Led Workshops. At the end of Term 2 2022 and Term 3 2022 our teachers led a variety of workshops based on the new K-2 English Curriculum, the CSO Data Dashboard, Stage 2 and 3 English Scope and Sequences, Action Research, Student Behaviour, Engagement and Well Being Support, Mathematic Curriculum and also quality assessment practises in Religious Education. Being NESA accredited and aligning to the proficient teacher standards, these workshops were well received by our teachers and supported the work that they do in our classrooms.

Learning Symposium

The St Edward's Learning Symposium was held in March of 2022. This two day event provided a space for teachers to share and reflect on their professional learning journey with colleagues, students, leaders and parents. This was completed by undertaking an embedded professional development programme that included key instructional time spent in learning spaces, reflective writing tasks and meetings with other colleagues. The launch of the school book which contains "whole of school" action research projects undertaken at St Edward's Primary School, showcased teacher professional learning through a job embedded professional development initiative. The goal of supporting teachers to undertake professional learning through job embedded professional development initiatives aims to support teacher collaboration and innovation by giving them freedom to explore new ideas without feeling like they are compromising on their day-to-day classroom work. The end result is a selection of action research reports demonstrating how teaching can be improved through teacher-led inquiry into important questions about teaching.









Instructional **Focus**

Co-Teaching

Teaching pedagogy has increasingly become de-privatised, teachers no longer teaching a single class in isolation, but are now coplanning, co-teaching, co-evaluating and co-assessing to ensure quality differentiated learning experiences for students.

At St. Edward's, while not all of our learning spaces are able to incorporate all aspects of the co-teaching cycle, teachers are released together once a fortnight to collaboratively plan, moderate assessment and reflect on practice.

In Stage 3, where our learning spaces are set up to support co-teaching, teachers have begun co-teaching in writing, guided reading and mathematics lessons to fluidly group students based on their individual needs.







Learning Intentions & Success Criteria


All lessons or units of work start with a Learning Intention and Success Criteria. This makes learning visible for our students and demonstrates to them the knowledge and skills they will be learning in the lesson and what they need to do in order to be successful.

Teachers 'unpack' the Learning Intentions and Success Criteria and these become an essential reference point for providing specific and timely feedback to students on their learning.













Knowing Beginning Points

Pre-Kinder Assessments

Our Pre-Kindergarten program allows us to know the starting point of each of our learners in order to develop challenging and supportive programs for each individual. We devote our time to engaging with preschools to gain knowledge and understanding of the whole child as well as administering our own assessments to investigate children's language skills, motor skills, vision and hearing. All of this information combined means that we can support families to access allied health services prior to starting kindergarten if required in order to give each child the opportunity to thrive in kindergarten.









Multilit Program

St Edward's School provides multi-tiered levels of intervention. All of our students in Kindergarten to Year 2 access the Multilit whole class program called InitaLit. This is a synthetic phonics program that sets students up for success in reading by systematically teaching letters, sounds and sight words. For some students additional reading intervention is required and we offer small group support through the use of the MiniLit program. This is an explicit early literacy program for teaching reading skills to the bottom 25% of students. Another of the programs from the MultiLit suite that is used to support students is the Reading Tutor Program. This program is delivered to students 1:1 by a trained paraprofessional with a focus on basic functional reading skills.













Focus on Progress

Termly PM Assessments

At St. Edwards our goal is to have 80% of our students achieve benchmark levels in their reading from Kindergarten to Year 6 each year. Our teachers are provided time to PM Benchmark students each Term, this growth data is collected and loaded in the CSO Data EcoSystem. This data tracks students' instructional reading level, so it is valuable for teachers when planning future guided reading lessons to support the individual needs of the reader.



Student Progress Meetings

At St. Edward's School the Student Learning Progress Conferences include parents/carers, teachers and the students. This approach is used consistently throughout the whole school and provides a forum for teachers, students and parents to acknowledge student progress and achievement. The Student Learning Progress Conferences allows for shared responsibility of student learning, assessment and reporting while strengthening communication channels with parents about student's learning and progress. It critically involves students in self-assessment and allows them to take responsibility for their own learning as they work toward and achieve curriculum outcomes.



Rules for Living

The Catholic Schools Office in Armidale has developed a wellbeing framework called "Living Well, Learning Well" which all 24 schools in the diocese use to support academic and wellbeing needs of all students. One element of this framework that is well used at St Edward's School are the "Rules for Living". These three simple rules: I am safe, I am valued, respected and cared for and I am a learner underpin all engagement, wellbeing and academic support provided at our school. All staff and students are well versed in these rules for living, and understand what their role is in ensuring that St Edward's is a safe, respectful, learning-centred school.







Fostering Understanding

Parent Workshops

Parents are key in ensuring that children are given the best opportunity to grow and flourish at school.

That's why our Parent Workshops are key in supporting our parents to know, understand and articulate the most effective ways they can support their child's learning from home.







Parent Learning Walks

Learning walks at St Edward's are designed to support professional learning for teachers and encourage collegial conversations. It is hoped that through the engagement of parents in learning walks we will increase the potential to facilitate powerful and reflective conversations around teaching and learning with our parents and therefore support improved student learning outcomes.

Research indicates that through the engagement of parents and carers, student learning outcomes are significantly enhanced. 'Parental and Community Engagement' establishes the importance of developing relationships with parents and providing opportunities for them to engage with the teaching and learning processes that are being implemented at a school level.













Parents and Friends Association & School Advisory Council

At St. Edward's, we are lucky enough to have a passionate parent body who have formed an enthusiastic Parents & Friends Association where all members of our school community are welcomed to help organise events that raise funds to various school projects. Over the last 12 months our P&F have organised whole school activities such as a trivia night, colour run, pie and mango drive, a golf day and other activities where we can gather as a school community.

In consultation with the school principal, nominated parents have also volunteered to become members of our School Advisory Council.



Whole School Carnivals

Fostering school spirit was enhanced with our annual sports carnivals. Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country carnivals were eagerly anticipated events on the school calendar. The house cups were eagerly contested with much house pride evident.

These carnivals were a great opportunity for the school to come together as one, celebrate sporting achievement and enjoy school spirit.





















Representative Team & Individual Sports

With the lifting of pandemic regulations our students were able to participate in our representative selection carnivals. 2022 saw students selected to participate at Diocesan, Polding and State carnivals in Athletics, swimming, Rugby League, Basketball, touch football, Cross Country and Netball.



St. Edward's utilises the abundance of professional sports coaches that we have in our regional area. These individual coaches or professional sporting organisations deliver 5 week fundamental skills courses from Kindergarten to Year 6, that align directly to our Physical Education curriculum.


In 2022 these sports included Gymnastics, Basketball, Tennis and Cricket.

Sacramental Programs
